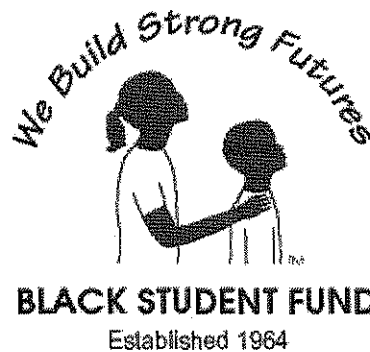

- Submit school information sheet and an official high school transcript
- Candidates must be US Citizens or permanent residents to be eligible
